## TREASURER'S MESSAGE

As you are all aware, the sum total description for the performance of the financial markets, both domestic and foreign, is tumultuous, to say the least.

The impact on the Section has seen the investment account contract. But I am happy to say, in recent months, we have outperformed the market in our recovery by several percentage points. The diversity of the portfolio, under the management of Mediquis Asset Advisors Inc., has allowed for less risk but again, despite this, recent market declines have not left any sector untouched. It will be important for the Board to examine the other investment strategies available for this account. These will be presented at our Board meeting by the head of Mediquis, Joel Blau, who will guide us to try to minimize risk, while creating the long term growth envisioned for these assets. Mr. Blau will also be giving a presentation entitled "*Ready for the Next Bear Market? How to Build a Weather-Proof Portfolio*" to meeting attendees on Friday at 11:20 a.m.

Regarding year to year operations, the Section derives the necessary funds for its activities largely through the Annual Meeting revenues. This year, as with last, is showing that the resiliency of our industry colleagues has suffered as well, given the present economic climate. For this year's meeting, we have already seen a number of companies pull out of the meeting, after they had initially committed. Fortunately, despite this attrition, we have achieved the budgeted amount for exhibitors with sales outpacing last year's offshore meeting in Puerto Rico. The largest decline in corporate support has been seen for the event sponsorships during the meeting, as well as scholarship/resident prizes/travel stipends. These contractions are also, unfortunately, being experienced at the national AUA meeting level.

Meeting attendance looks to be strong and this will certainly help the overall position - a credit to the organizers for the robust and engaging program set forth.

Overall measures are taking place to 'readjust' expenditures for the meeting where possible and the Board will closely examine these new economic realities for their effects on the upcoming years' budgets.

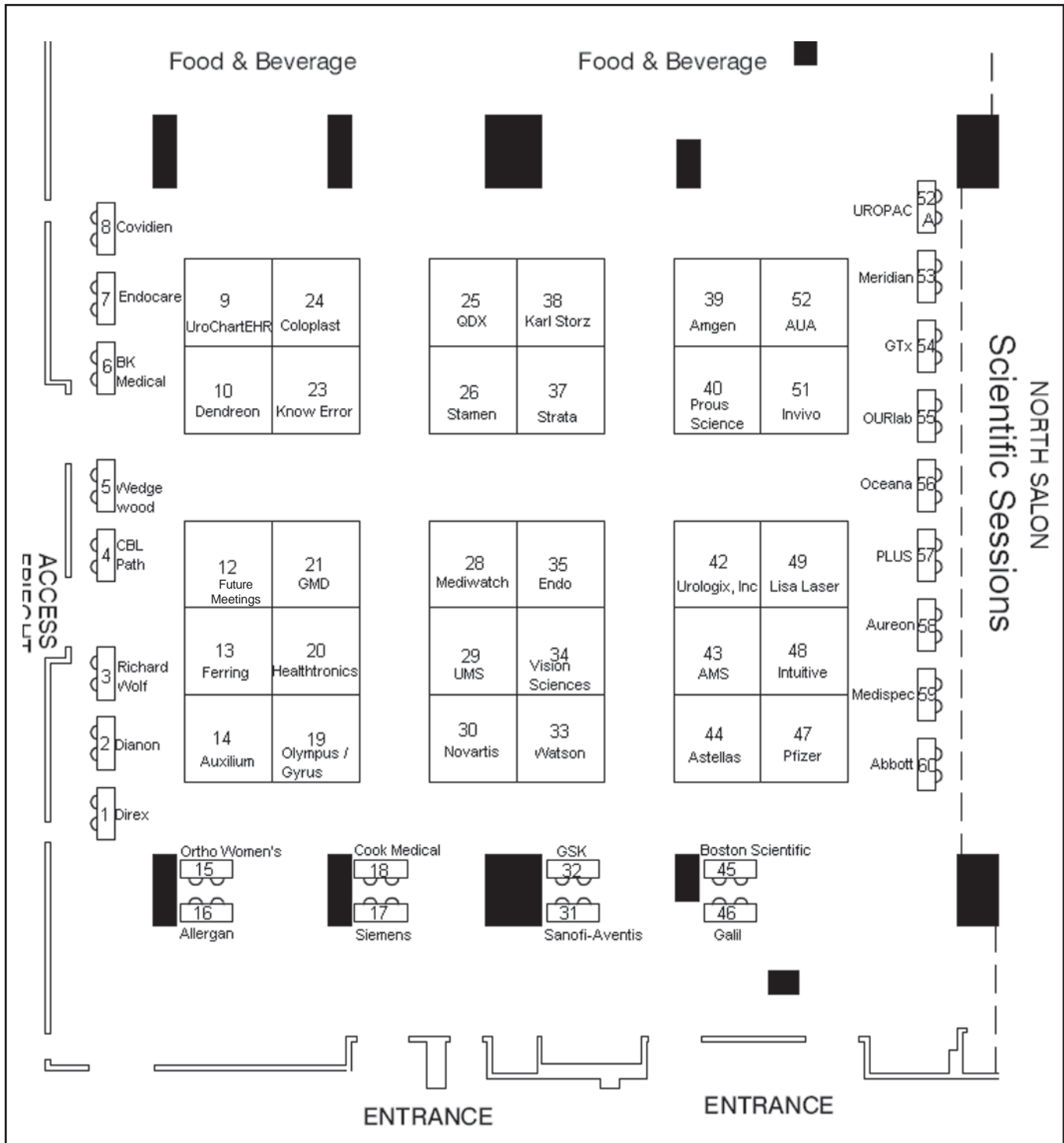
